KU Term GPA Requirements:

2.00 KU Term GPA for students with less than 45 attempted (A-F) KU hours.

2.50 KU Term GPA for students with 45 or more attempted (A-F) KU hours.

Faculty Mentor Program Requirements

Meet with your faculty mentor at least twice each semester, fall 2018 and spring 2019.

Fall 2018 meetings

- First meeting should occur between August 27 – September 14th
- Second meeting should occur between October 8th – November 16th

Retention Advisor Requirements

Meet with your retention advisor at least twice during fall 2018.
